The “Federal Reporting Standard” counts only one identity per student and adds to 100%. For multi-racial students, it includes a “2 or more races” category. The “All Self-Reported Identities” standard exceeds 100% because students can indicate two or more races/ethnicities and appear in more than one category. Race/ethnicity data does not include international students in either standard. Headcounts for Fall 2023 and 2024 cohorts are 1,418 and 1,389 students, respectively, and include Arts & Sciences, Engineering, Peabody divisions.
